



The Industrial Maintenance Technology Program of Lone Star College-CyFair (Cypress, Texas, U.S.A.) is seeking equipment and educational materials to use as instructional aids. Any type of equipment, new or used, will be greatly appreciated – small pumps, hydraulic cylinders and compo-

The program is also seeking advisory committee members and adjunct faculty. The advisory committee meets a few times throughout the year to discuss and review the curriculum and industry needs. Adjunct faculty are part-time instructors responsible for teaching courses related to their education or industry. Adjunct faculty support full-time faculty to teach courses hosted at non-conventional times (nights and weekends), or

for courses that are unique to industry. Adjunct faculty require a minimum of an associate's degree and three years of industry experience. Some exceptions can be made.

Lone Star College-CyFair was built in 2003 as a response to the needs of the growing residential and industrial communities of north-west Harris County.

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
